16th ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on the Environment

Minister Grace Fu attended the 16th ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on Environment (AMME) on 21 – 22 Oct 2021, where parties discussed efforts national and regional environmental protection. The AMME finalised a Joint Statement to emphasise ASEAN's importance to global efforts on climate, energy, and nature at the upcoming COP-26. The meeting endorsed the ASEAN-China Joint Statement on Green Enhancing and Sustainable Development Cooperation. Members also supported Brunei Darussalam's proposal to set up the ASEAN Climate Change Centre and organise the ASEAN Youth on Climate








Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the NEA and US-ASEAN Business Council

Through active dialogues and exchange of ideas, best practices, and the latest technological solutions, both countries can strengthen and develop initiatives on the sustainability agenda.





Launch of LowCarbonSG

On 26 Oct 2021, Minister Fu launched the LowCarbonSG (LCSG), a nationwide capability building programme to support companies in monitoring and reducing their carbon emissions.
